

Benefits of Youth Employment

- a. Build confidence and self-reliance
- b. Increase responsibility and independence
- c. Less likely to drop out of school
- d. More likely to graduate high school
- e. Decrease that chance of future court involvement
- f. Establish contacts and references
- g. Fine-tune soft skills

** According to the U.S. Department of Labor, for every year a person works in their teens, their income raises by 14-16% in their 20s.

That's an increase of 56-64%!

EET is now available in multiple counties throughout Washington

Builds Employment and School protective factors

Court Involved Youth that are identified as Moderate or High Risk of additional charges

15-18 years old

EET Overview

- Referral
- Intake Assessment and confirmation with JPC
- Action Plan in line with CMAP
- School engagement/support
- Job readiness Training
- Site Development
- Incentives, stipends for milestone attainments
- Paid employment Internship placement. 150 hours after school or summer.
- Case management/ stipends
- Transition Exit and Risk Assessment reporting
- Program Management and QA

Job Readiness Training

- Self Evaluation
- Career Interest Exploration
- Resume Writing
- Application Skills
- Interviewing
- Retaining Employment
- Completion Bonus

Why EET?

- Builds identified protective factors
- Addresses risk: out of school and unemployed
- ▶ Understand work and relationship to school.
- ► Community service can be satisfied.
- Outcomes are measurable.
- ▶ Compliments other EBP interventions.
- Opportunity to pay legal financial obligations.
- Develops community support and involvement with at-risk youth.
- Can restore community through visible projects in high crime areas.
- Having employment history at early age significantly impacts future prospects for positive employment.


